**ORDER TO REVOKE MX OP-1 PROVISIONAL OPERATING AUTHORITY AND
CEASE ALL INTERSTATE TRANSPORTATION**

This Order is issued pursuant to 49 CFR 385.111(c)(2). Previously, by way of your "Notice of Conditional Rating and Order of Proposed Revocation Letter" dated December 20, 2013, the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration (FMCSA) notified you that your MX OP-1 "Provisional Operating Authority", would be revoked unless you presented evidence of necessary corrective action by January 19, 2014. Because you have failed to submit adequate evidence of necessary corrective actions your MX OP-1 "Provisional Operating Authority" is revoked, effective immediately.

Failure to comply with this Order may subject the carrier to penalty provisions in 49 USC 521(b)(2)(A) not to exceed \$10,000 for each offense.

In accordance with 49 CFR 385.113, you may request an administrative review if you believe the FMCSA has committed an error in assigning a safety rating or suspending or revoking your MX OP-1 "Provisional Operating Authority". Your request must fully explain the error you believe the FMCSA committed in assigning the safety rating or suspending or revoking the MX OP-1 "Provisional Operating Authority" and include any information or documents in support thereof.

The FMCSA will complete its administrative review no later than 10 days after you submit your request for review.

The Associate Administrator's decision will constitute final agency action. Your request must be submitted in English to:

In accordance with 49 CFR 385.115, a Mexico-domiciled motor carrier whose MX OP-1 "Provisional Operating Authority" has been revoked may reapply under 49 CFR Parts 365 or 368 no sooner than 30 days after the date of the revocation. If you do so, you will need to initiate the application process from the beginning and pay another application fee. You also will be required to demonstrate how you have corrected the deficiencies that resulted in the revocation of your MX OP-1 "Provisional Operating Authority" and how you will ensure that you now have adequate basic safety management controls. A Pre-authorization Safety Audit will be required if you apply for Provisional Operating Authority under 49 CFR Part 365.
